Dear colleagues,

I find this an opportune moment for us to reconvene this forum of AFSEC, and would be honoured if you would participate.

AFSEC17 brings together Ministers, Chiefs of Defence, Commanders of Navies and Coast Guards, as well as maritime experts to discuss the provision of effective maritime security and identify practical solutions to maritime challenges at a time of recapitalisation of west African fleets.

The central objective is to share best practice and promote greater regional integration and cooperation in the procurement, training, deployment and coordination of the capabilities required to ensure maritime security.

AFSEC last took place in February 2014 in Casablanca and provided a valued forum for the international community and security leaders from West Africa. The forum was a success due to the participation of key leaders. The 2014-2016 Ebola Outbreak in West Africa prevented the forum reconvening for regular annual updates.

Three years later, with much progress made in the maritime security of the region, there are still worrying incidents of piracy and other transnational threats with this trend likely to continue. This paradox is reflected in the April 2016 Presidential Statement of the UN Security Council, while the newly adopted African Charter on Maritime Security, Safety and Development, October 2016, offers hope given its multilateral content and context.

The AFSEC 17 Summit is supported by the Centre for Maritime Law and Security Africa; and has managed to secure the participation of the senior leaders required to develop meaningful discussions and practical outcomes.

I hope you will be able to join us in Casablanca in May 2017 and make your contribution to the debate on best practice in maritime security..

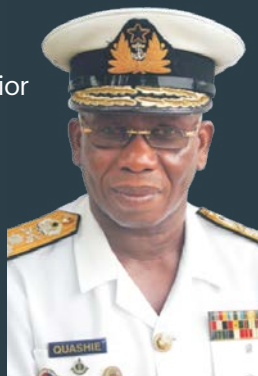

10:00 GoGIN PROJECT PRESENTATION

On 14 October 2016, the European Union (EU) and several West African coastal countries launched the Gulf of Guinea Inter-regional Network (GoGIN) in Lomé where the Extraordinary African Union Summit on Maritime Security and Development was being held.

GoGIN aims to facilitate cooperation between the 19 Gulf of Guinea coastal countries from Senegal to Angola by setting up an effective and technically-efficient network for the exchange of information to improve and coordinate maritime security strategy in the region.

- The four-year project has a total budget of just under 9.3 million Euros. The EU will provide 7.5 million Euros and Denmark will contribute 1.785 million Euros
- The GoGIN Support Agency will allocate funds to regional or national endeavours to promote maritime security and combat piracy
- GoGIN is one of a series of measures and resolutions which followed on from the 2013 Yaoundé Security Summit. It replaces the EU's Critical Maritime Routes in the Gulf of Guinea project (CRIMGO)
- Like CRIMGO, GoGIN will be implemented by the French state agency, France Expertise, in cooperation with the Gulf of Guinea's regional and national instances
